#### ✦ Early On

Will Hurley felt a tug on his heart that he just couldn't ignore. He knew he needed to be baptized. He had been "baptized" as a child, but said he hadn't committed to living his life for the Lord until he was 16.

"At my home church they did baptisms twice a year, and every time I would feel a little tug." He said. "Even though I was baptized before, I thought, 'Maybe I need to be up there.'"

Will graduated High School in Lake Zurich, Ill. in 2007, and then joined the Marines. After finishing boot camp, he came to Eastern in January of 2008. He found Christian Campus House through Ashley Chamberlain, who is also from Lake Zurich. He was three weeks into his classes and regularly attending CCH events when he got the call. He was needed in Iraq.

#### ✦ Off To Iraq

While in Iraq, he faced a lot of challenges as a believer.

"It is difficult to be a Christian in the military." He said, "It was draining and there were hardly any other Christians there for fellowship."

Will had to find new ways to find time with God, whether that was prayer at night when he went to bed, or asking God for strength while taking a walk. Being in Iraq also brought Will back to the tug in his heart.

"I thought about it a lot," He said, "I was just thinking, 'What if something happens and I haven't made that outward commitment on my own?'"

At that point, Will was ready to be baptized. As he stood in the Euphrates River, he thought about how cool it would be to be baptized there. However, the opportunity never presented itself. Fortunately, Will returned to the U.S. unharmed in August after a little more than 4 months in Iraq.

#### ✦ Back to Eastern and Christian Campus House

Will immediately started with classes again at Eastern and was back involved at CCH. He joined a family group and his family group leader, Aaron York, was immediately impressed with Will.

"He's four years younger than me, and he is more mature," Aaron said. "He studies the Bible and always has a lot to add to the discussion."

As he continued to feel the "tug" inside him about baptism, and after hearing Roger speak about it in one of his messages, Will brought up the subject to Aaron. They went over a packet that Roger has put together for anyone who has questions about baptism.

"One of the main things that affected me was that even Jesus decided to get baptized," Will said, "If anyone didn't need to be baptized it was him, but he wanted to."

Will knew now was the time for him to take that step, to make this decision, his decision. At their next family group meeting Will asked Aaron if he would baptize him. And the next Wednesday night, after Bible Study, the students of Christian Campus House got to see Will baptized.

Aaron said he was excited to see Will make that decision and Will was even more excited to have finally answered the tug at his heart.

I get to see Stanley and still take care of him throughout the day, but thanks to the wonderful women who love watching Stanley, I am able to keep working here full time!

It seems that Stanley has had his own ministry here at the Campus House. It did not take long for the office environment to change significantly. I, for one, had to loosen up a little bit on my schedule. Formerly very task-oriented, Stanley has helped me to slow down and focus more on the people around me. It's not uncommon for the staff to all be in the office lounge hanging out with Stanley. He has definitely lightened up the atmosphere and brought a lot of laughter into the office. Cherie, our secretary, frequently comments on how she cannot imagine the office without Stanley and she definitely looks forward to coming to work on the days that she gets to see him.

✂ **Building Fund**

Our current indebtedness (as of 12-9-08) stands at \$219,478.32. The CCH board of directors' goal is to retire this debt by the end of 2010. Donations to the building fund have also dropped, in part due to the economic slump. Want to help? Send your check to us and mark it for "Building Fund."
